

# **New Sanctuary Design**

On June 21st the proposed changes to the Sanctuary were approved at a congregational meeting.

The work on the Sanctuary should be completed by the end of July, just in time for VBS. Volunteers will be needed initially for preliminary removal of railings and carpet. As the work progresses we will need painters, and house cleaning.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. 1 Corinthians 10:11

In the next several weeks you will see some big changes to the front of our worship space. The proposal to improve the front of the sanctuary passed at the congregational meeting on June 21st, and work will be beginning right away.

The basic motivation for the project was to create a worship space that was fully accessible to all. Currently, we commune at the altar, kneeling at the top level of the chancel, or altar area of the church. However, to get to that level, stairs needed to be negotiated, and that is a hazard for some going both up and down. In the last several months there have been some near falls, and so it was something that needed to be addressed. Also, for those who chose not to try and climb the stairs there has been a place to stand or kneel on the main level. However, those who did so were separated from the rest of the community, making almost a two-tiered system for communion: those who could aproach the altar and those who could not.

One of our basic beliefs about the gift of Holy Communion is that it not only allows us to commune (be in community) with Christ, but it also brings us into community with one another. "St. Paul writes in First Corinthians: "because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." When we commune we are the one body of Christ together. Communion unites us with one another in Christian worship, fellowship and service. And communing together in one space, where we are not separated from one another based on physical ability, witnesses to our conviction that we truly are one body in Christ.

There is an ancient Latin saying in the church that goes like this, "lex orandi, lex credendi" which translated means, "the rule of worship is the rule of belief." In other words, the way in which we worship says a great deal about what we believe. Making our sanctuary accessible to all for communion allows us to bring how we worship closer in line to what we believe, and that is that we are all one body of believers in Christ Jesus.

Now with any project there will be a lot of work that needs to be done, and some time in which to complete it. There will be a few short weeks when the sanctuary will not be available for our worship. In that time we will be worshipping in the fellowship hall, or if weather permits on a Thursday night, perhaps outside. I would encourage everyone to support this project that we are undertaking together however you are able. And while the work is being done, continue to worship together regularly. Our worship in the fellowship hall can be very meaningful, and even more intimate than it is in the sanctuary. Our Wednesday evening services in Lent are an example of that. My hope is that in the limited time we are in the fellowship hall, our services will be full and lively.

I look forward to seeing this project progress and realizing the goal of having a more accessible worship space. The new design will also be more flexible and will allow us more room for youth and Sunday School services, and will also allow us to be better hosts for concerts and other events.

Thank you for your support as a congregation and we look forward to seeing you in worship this summer.


would like members to sign up for a room or area as listed out in the fellowship hall list.


