Hurried and Tired?

...from Pastor Nelson

Many of us live hurried lives. Young singles go from home to work to Friends to The Fitness Zone to the Mall to the Movies to the Ambrosia Diner - then Home to sleep a few hours, and it starts all over again! Families go from Work to McDonald's to Soccer or Little League to Mr. Big Stuff - then Home to Feed the Dog & Do the Laundry; we go until Exhaustion and then repeat it all again the next day! Even those who are retired often say, "I'm so busy now, I don't know how I once held down a job!"

People are exhausted as they enter into the weekend, which consists of projects, housecleaning, lawn mowing, sporting events, and family gatherings. As Monday rolls around they are tired before the work-week begins, and then comes another hectic week with over-commitments. We hurry from one place to another, living with "routine panic," as joy and enthusiasm for life are smothered.

What is missing from the above picture? Or even better asked, Who is missing from the above picture. GOD! How does God help us with our hurried and fatigued life?

God helps us with our attitude.

The root of our hurried lives is often "works-righteousness" and guilt. In other words, we hurry so much because we feel we must please God by our efforts, or please our parents, or our children. Or, we pridefully try to keep up with what others do. And if we don't do it all, we feel the guilt of failure. The Good News of Jesus Christ is that we don't have to earn our way into His good graces. God loves us and forgives us completely, which takes away our guilt. Furthermore, we can *never* please everyone, or do everything everyone else is doing, and the Lord doesn't ask that of us.

God helps us with our priorities.

We can begin each week with the Lord. Sunday morning worship sets a direction for the week. Our sins of the past are forgiven. We have a fresh start and hope for the new week. On Sunday afternoon and evening, it is a blessing to take a break from the labor of the week. God originally designed the Sabbath as a "break" day – renewal for the soul, refreshment for the body. We do well to trust God and take a "break." The work we are called to do, will get done in His time. The "hurried" attitude fades, as we trust God enough to "take a break." Priorities after God fall into place: family, work, other activities.

God helps us set boundaries.

With priorities inspired by God, we can say "No" where that is necessary. We may sometimes need to say "No" to extended family gatherings, to the boss, to our children, to community activities, to church activities, to sporting events. Confidence and faith in God helps us to draw lines so that our lives are not too full, and that the most important things are not neglected.

Think of your life like a Thanksgiving Feast. There are many wonderful dishes and desserts to eat. But, if we load our plates too high, we will soon be sick of it all! With God's grace and forgiveness in Jesus, and with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we can live full, busy, and productive lives without the hurriedness and tiredness of this age.

Prayer for Forgiveness, Renewal and Guidance

Lord, you graciously give me 24 hours each day. Forgive me for so often cluttering this precious time with too many things. I ask that you would renew my attitude, help me to know my boundaries, and guide me in setting my priorities in ways that are pleasing to you. This I ask through Jesus Christ. Amen.

A CONVERSATION ABOUT SUMMER WORSHIP

from Pastor Nelson

INTERVIEWER: How does the busyness of Summer relate to your worship?

JILL: Summer is the busiest season for me. It seems like every weekend we have something going: weddings, picnics, vacations, day trips, sports outings. Not to mention the extra yard work and gardening. I can't even think about worship.

JOHN: Like Jill, I'm very busy also. But I believe it's our duty to show up at church. "Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy," says the Third Commandment. Sure, I'd rather be out having fun like Jill. If I get to the 8:15 am service, I can get it over with in an hour, and the rest of the day is mine.

JANE: Summer is a busy time. But even so, with holidays and vacation, I have more time in the Summer than any other season. I find worship renewing and refrehing for my body and soul. It helps me make better use of the time I have. It reminds me that time is not just for myself but for God and others also. I need that reminder.

INTERVIEWER: How does the weather influence your desire to worship?

JILL: We have a lot of cold and rainy seasons in the Catskills. The Summers are usually beautiful. As they say, "make hay while the sun shines." I can go to church anytime, but you don't always have great weather to enjoy.

JOHN: Come rain or sun, sleet or hail, you'll find me in church on Sunday. If everyone has Jill's attitude, the church would be empty on sunny days. One advantage of going to church on hot days – it's air conditioned!

JANE: With such lovely summer weather, it's sometimes tempting to "skip" worship. But then I try to remember Who gave us the beautiful sunshine & the warm breeze, Who gave me the health to enjoy it, Who gave His life for me so I can rejoice each & every day. These thoughts move me to praise, worship & give thanks to the Lord.

INTERVIEWER: Do out-of-town guests influence your worship participation?

JILL: When people travel a distance to see us, what kind of host would I be if I left them alone to go to church? They came to see us – not an emply house or a church. Besides, we usually plan activiities on Sunday, before they have to leave in the afternoon.

JOHN: I don't buy that argument, Jill. If you had a doctor's appointment, you'd keep it and your guests would undersatnd. Who'is more important, some doctor or God? I go to church. I want my guests to know that I'm a good Christian. I also get to visit with friends at church.

JANE: The best gift I can offer any guest is a relationship with Jesus Christ. I let my guests know ahead of time that I'll be worshipping the Living God on Sunday. Sometimes they come with me. When they don't, they may ask about the service afterwards, & this gives me an opportunity to witness. If not, my worship is a silent witness that Jesus is my Savior.

INTERVIEWER: How do children affect your Summer worship?

JILL: With Sunday School & Church services, they get enough religion during the school year. I don't want to force religion down their throats. If I brought them, we'd be fighting all Sunday morning, & none of us would get anything out of it, except a headache.

JOHN: How will children ever respect God and the Ten Commandments, if they are repeatedly allowed to break the Third Commandment? You just make them to go to church – they'll get over it!

JANE: I expect my children to worship with me. There is not a discussion or argument every Sunday. Worship is something that we do as a Christian family. Sometimes they misbehave and have to be attended to. When I worship, God helps me to be more forgiving and patient toward my children. He helps me keep parenting in the right perspective.

INTERVIEWER: Do you worship when you're out of town?

JILL: Our vacation time is so short as it is – we're paying good money to be away. We can't spend time looking for a church – besides all this, Sunday is often a travel day for us.

JOHN: I ask Pastor Neslon for a list of the Lutheran churches in the area I'm viisting. If there isn't a Lutheran church there, then I have my excuse for not going to church. If there's a Lutheran church there, then I feel I must put my time in.

JANE: We do take time for worship when we're away. I enjoy fellowshiping with other Chrisitians in different parts of the country, sometimes of different denominations. Sometimes I can encourage them in faith & sometimes they encourage me. Once in Quebec, when no English-speaking church was nearby – we had a brief family worship & devotions. I usually bring a Bulletin back to Pastor Nelson, becaue I know he enjoys seeing what other churches are doing. No matter where in the world I am on Sunday, it's still the Lord's Day – a day to recall his death & resurrection, and be refreshed for the week ahead.

Exterior Work Done - Brickwork and siding were completed.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT...

How Can We Enrich The Lives Of Others?

As Christian stewards, we are thoroughly convinced that all that we are and have - including our time and talents – are a trust from God to be used in His service and to enrich the lives of others. Are we willing to participate?

The Gift of Time: When God gives life, he hides from us how much time our life will have. The faithful steward uses it wisely in accord with God's will. Time, once gone, cannot be retrieved. God knows we must spend some of our time on ourselves. Selflessness is spending some of our time to help others. A church community provides its stewards with opportunities to give of their time to help others in organized projects.

The Gift of Talent: God gives everyone potential talents when they are born. One dimension of stewardship is for each person to actualize those potential talents, while another dimension is to use the talents wisely. There are various possibilities for sharing talents, including helping others; spreading the gospel; leading Bible studies; involvement in music or choir; serving as usher, lector or greeter; visitor to the sick and elderly. The list goes on and on for those creatively wishing to give of their talents & time.

The Gift of Treasure: Stewardship of treasure, correctly handling God's financial gifts to us, is the "why" of our giving. As God has prospered us, so we thankfully return to Him a portion of those gifts for His work. Although some give far more, many of God's people follow the old testament guideline of returning a tithe (10%) of their income to the Lord. It takes time to grow in financial stewardship, as in other areas of our faith life. Therefore, many plan incremental increases in giving by percentage amounts over several years. The joys and blessings experienced along the way. however, often urge people along more quickly than they had originally planned.
